Make sure those you care about are are provided for

Before you visit your solicitor, its best to make sure you've done a little preparation at home. This can save you time in the solicitor's office, and costs for preparing your Will.

Estimate the value of your assets

People often underestimate the value of their assets. Draw up a list of what you currently owe, including outstanding mortgages, loans or bills. Similarly list what you currently own and it's likely value.

Decide who you would like to benefit from your Will

Make a list of the people and organisations you want to benefit from your estate, and consider in how you would divide your assets among them.

Appoint your executors

You can appoint between one and four executors to be responsible for carrying out your wishes. These can be family members, friends and/or a solicitor.

Find a solicitor

Take information with you

To save time (and money) when you go to a solicitor, take an up to date list of your assets and liabilities, as well as the names and addresses of everyone you want to benefit from your will.

Your circumstances may alter over time. Review every few years to ensure it still reflects your wishes.
